### **Background to the EPOSTL**

### What is the EPOSTL?

The European Portfolio for Student Teachers of Languages is a catalogue of didactic competences which encourages both students undergoing their initial teacher education and practising teachers to reflect on the didactic knowledge and skills necessary to teach languages. It helps them to self-assess their own competences and enables them to monitor their progress. The EPOSTL was developed for the ECML (European Centre for Modern Languages of the Council of Europe) by an international team coordinated by David Newby and builds on important principles from the Common European Framework of Reference.

### Who uses the EPOSTL?

The EPOSTL is used at universities and teacher education institutions throughout Europe and has been translated into 14 languages. The EPOSTL has the potential to act as a bridge between initial teacher education, teaching practice and in-service teacher development and thus contribute to raising the quality of language teaching.
